

16th Annual Banquet-October 10th, 2015

The Delaware Aviation Hall of Fame (DAHF) will induct six notable First State aviation achievers for 2015. The inductees will be celebrated at an Honors Banquet at the University of Delaware's Clayton Hall on October 10, 2015. Founded in 2000 to commemorate outstanding service in military and civilian aviation, the Hall of Fame has now recognized, through 2014, a total of 91 current or former Delawareans who have made outstanding contributions to the advancement of aviation/aerospace in Delaware, brought singular credit to the First State in their achievements elsewhere and/or have shown gallantry in aviation in service to the First State and/or the Nation.

The gala affair kicks off with a reception starting at 5:00 PM. Exhibits featuring memorabilia of the inductees will be displayed in the reception area along with aviation-related paintings, past inductees' displays, aircraft models, etc. The opening ceremony commences at 6:00, with a bagpiper and Color Guard leading the procession of the inductees and their wingmen. This year's wingmen (DAHF trustees) will introduce their respective inductees to the assembly, using large-screen visual presentations as part of their induction ceremony. DAHF President Jim Hickin will confer the ribbon medallions and award plaques to the inductees.

Following dinner, the **2015 Youth Aviation Achievement Award** will be presented to **Moriah Graham** of Smyrna, Delaware.

Arthur GormanHis contribution to aviation spans 50 years and, from his home base in Delaware, includes several key military, commercial and general aviation contributions as pilot, First Officer, Flight Instructor, aircraft salesman, through which he accumulated an accident free 8,400 flight hours and resulting in Art being presented with the FAA's Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award in 2011.



Richard Dorsey Morgan-Grew up in Delaware, Colonel Morgan became a transport pilot and was President of Air Service, Inc. before his induction into the U.S. Army Air Corps at the beginning of the Second World War. He rose to the rank of Colonel and commanded a base at Bengal, India where he also flew missions over "The Hump" to the air forces in China.



a U.S. Army Air Corps flight instructor who was later assigned to the Air Transport Command as a Flight Officer Service Pilot and instructor pilot, he flew "The Hump" until his separation from the service in 1946. For over 40 years he managed Laurel Airport where he was a Power line Patrol Pilot, flight instructor and F.A.A. designated

pilot.



Ernest SchwabWith over 20,00 combined flight hours flying as a U.S. Marine pilot, Delaware Air National Guard pilot, Pan American Airways pilot and private pilot, as well as his military command experience and work with FlightSafety International, Colonel Schwab has shown the type of outstanding contribution to the advancement of aviation in Delaware that exemplifies inductees in the Delaware Aviation Hall of

Fame.
